

## Main players in DG Enlargement

- □ Unit D1 IPA Strategy and Quality
- **Unit D3** Regional Cooperation and Programmes
- Geographical Units B1 (Croatia, Montenegro), B2 (the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), C1 (Bosnia and Herzegovina), C2 (Serbia), C3 (Kosovo\*) and C4 (Albania)

## Main roles and responsibilities – Unit D1

> overall strategic framework for IPA II incl. CBC

- regulatory framework for IPA II (for CBC this includes drafting the RAP)
- > preparation of the IPA II Programming Guide incl. a dedicated section on CBC
- providing guidance on templates to be used (e.g. Programme Template, Annual Implementation Report etc)





## Main roles and responsibilities – Unit D3

- overall coordination of CBC programmes at intra-WB borders, CBC with MS and transnational programmes based on proposals from geographical units and EUDs (regular meetings)
- ensure proper reflection of CBC in MCSP based on priorities included in each of the CSPs
- guidance and compilation of the **budgetary tables** for the allocation of IPA funds per programme (based on input from the geographical units)
- manage the CBIB+ TA project (in close cooperation with geographical units and EUDs)





## Main roles and responsibilities – Geographical Units

- ensure incorporation of priorities and targets for CBC in CSP
- propose eligible areas and budget allocation for each programme
- Strategic planning and programming: ensure, in close coordination with D1 and D3, timely preparation and adoption of CBC programmes (incl. launching ISC and presentation of programmes to IPA Committee)





#### Main roles and responsibilities – EUDs

- Contribute to identification of eligible areas and meaningful projects
- Implementation of CBC programmes under direct management wherever applicable





#### **Programme preparation**

- Preparation of programmes by national authorities of the countries involved in the programme in close cooperation with both EUDs, the geographical units concerned and CBIB+ TA (programming experts) on basis of template
- Verification / checking by Commission services (D1, D3, geographical units, EUDs)





## **Programme review and verification**

- Verification / checking by Commission services (D1, D3, geographical units, EUDs) prior to external consultations
- Various levels of review / checking: substance (geographical units, EUDs) and consistency (D3)
- Substance checking: ensure that CBC actions are based on priorities identified in the CSP
- Consistency checking: ensure budgets are coherent and in line with overall IPA II allocations for CBC; ensure respect for thematic priorities





## **Substance checking**

## Nature of checks (non-exhaustive list):

- Are the findings of the SWOT / PESTLE analysis in line with the selected thematic priorities?
- Did an adequate external consultation process take place and is it properly described?
- ✤ Is the programme eligible area well-defined and relevant?
- Is the socio-economic situation in the programme area described in a clear, unambiguous and understandable way?
- Have statistical data been included and a reference to the source has been provided?





## **Substance checking**

# Nature of checks (non-exhaustive list) cont'd:

- Is there a proper and logical explanation how the programme will address the needs in the programme area (i.e. there is a clear link between actions foreseen and thematic priorities selected)?
- Is the programme coherent with other EU or other donors' programmes?
- The programme strategy respects the fundamental principles of the logframe approach (for each thematic priority selected there is a clear description of specific objectives, expected results, indicators of success and type of activities)





## **Substance checking**

## Nature of checks (non-exhaustive list) cont'd:

Have horizontal and cross-cutting issues been properly incorporated (environmental protection, equal opportunities, gender equality)?





## **Consistency checking**

## Nature of checks (non-exhaustive list) cont'd:

- Are the thematic priorities stated in the programme in line with those identified in the CSF / RAP?
- The thematic priorities correspond to the countries' overall acession strategy and needs defined in the CSP?
- Justifications of financial allocations for each thematic priority have been provided?
- Financial tables are properly completed and mathematically correct?
- Maximum rate of Community contribution is respected?
